NOMINATING COMMITTEE

HOWARD EWING

Howard Ewing has agreed to talk at the meeting on **The 4-C's of faceting**. This should be an interesting talk with something for everyone.

Howard joined the Club about 1975, has been a Director, and worked several years at the Club Show before becoming a full time dealer. His interest in the Club came through Don Dallaire, who had joined in around 1974. Howard was an engineering manager for Digital Equipment Corporation. He is a member of the American Society of Gemcutters and was elected to Beta Beta Beta, National Biological Honor Society. He is also a fisherman, hiker, gemcutter, faceter, lapidarist, stamp collector, father, and husband of Bea. Howard has been a mineral collector since the 1970s, working in a variety of locations, such as Moat Mountain, the Government Pit (where he and Dave Kelso opened a pocket of 132 topaz crystals), Fonda NY, Nova Scotia, Rice Mine, Bennett Mine, and South Baldface Mountain – and many more. Over the years, he became more and more interested in faceting minerals and has developed a business centered on gem/lapidary/jewelry phase of the hobby. Faceting well takes patience – and Don Dallaire credits Howard with a great deal of patience, since he managed to teach Don how to facet.

NOTE: Though I believe it to be accurate, this must be considered an unauthorized biography, since I was unable to reach Howard before press time.
