(your choice)dip (carrots, celery,etc.)


Half & Half, pint for coffee Donut holes; brownies; cookies; pastry; finger vegetables

Speaker for April Frank Perham



Frank will be speaking on one or more of his numerous mineral experiences over the years. Frank is well known to most New England mineral enthusiasts and those who do not know of him are likely new to minerals or have spent too much time under a rock instead of collecting.

Frank obtained a BS in Geological Science from Bates College in Main and has over 45 years of mining and collecting in Maine's pegmatites. He comes from a family that was immersed in mining and minerals. Frank's father Stanley Perham was involved in feldspar mining and mineral specimens and the famous Perham's Maine Mineral store in West Paris. Frank's many years of working in these pegmatites has enabled him to "read" a pegmatite to find many mineral treasures. In the 1970's he was hired by Plumbago Mining to mine the Dunton Quarry in Newry with most of the incredible tourmaline crystals that were found were extracted by him for the mine owners. Frank still mines actively with his partner Barry Heath and several "assistants" in the summer months. His favorite specimens are not the usual "eye candy" most collectors prefer but those unusual specimens that make you wonder how Mother Nature came up with this mineral oddity. In fact one could write a book on Frank and that is currently in process.

The club program will be a treat for all those who attend.



Perhamite (Ca,Sr)₃Al_{7.7}Si₃P₄O_{23.5}(OH)_{14.1} 8H2O

A Calcium aluminum silico-phosphate New mineral described in 1977 by P. Dunn & D. Appleman and named after Frank Perham.

Hexagonal crystal, colorless, white to light brown often forming in globular clusters or rosettes. Crystals have a hardness of 5 with perfect cleavage

Museum of the White Mountains


The Museum of the White Mountains at Plymouth State University had a private preview of their new exhibition "Beyond Granite: The Geology of Adventure". The preview was attended by CMC members Gordon and Pam Jackson, Don & Kathy Dallaire and Pat Barker. The exhibition centers on three areas:

1. Pook climbing 2. Hiking White Mountain Geology and the Appelochion Trail and 3. Winter activities

1. Rock climbing, 2. Hiking White Mountain Geology and the Appalachian Trail and 3. Winter activities in the White Mountains. The display includes historical and modern gear used in the White Mountains for hiking, rock climbing, skiing, etc.

Of particular note is the 1877 Hitchcock New Hampshire Geological Map for which the club funded the restoration and framing. A plaque denoting this is on the wall describing the map.

In front of the map on a display table are many rock specimens that attendees can touch and examine. This is unique in the way identification tags were directly attached to the specimen so they remain with the specimen even when being handled. In addition there was a case displaying mineral specimens from the White Mountains including smoky quartz, microcline, topaz, fluorite and other specimens provided to the display by club members Gordon Jackson, Bob Whitmore and Don Dallaire.

Another very interesting feature is an interactive computer display of three regions of the White Mountains: Franconia Ridge, Cannon Cliff and Tuckerman and Huntington Ravines on Mt. Washington. With this display you can zoom in on any area in theses regions and see fantastic detail. There are points on the display that with a mere touch on the screen will zoom in automatically and a window opens describing the geological feature. This is cutting edge technology.

The display will be at the museum from March 15, 1914 through March 8, 2015. If you are in the area I would suggest you drop by to see the exhibit.
