Hoyt Hill Mine Orange, New Hampshire



On a recent trip to the Mineral Museum at Harvard University to take photos for an upcoming Rocks & Minerals article I noticed a specimen of muscovite. It was a single crystal approximately 5 centimeters thick and 12 centimeters high split in half. The muscovite was from the club's Hoyt Hill mine. I was surprised to stumble on this specimen.

Above: Specimen at Harvard with both halves showing the interior of the crystal.


The Hoyt Hill mine was operated for mica during the First World War and for a short time in 1935-36.

The mine was operated in 1943 and 1944 for mica as well by its owner at the time, Robert B. Coleman.

Muscovite obtained from the mine in 1943-44 was rum to ruby, extremely hard, flat and exceptionally free from structural defects. It yielded an exceptionally high percentage of sheet. The books averaged about 5 by 6 by 2 inches, and some books were 18 by 24 by 6 inches.

RULES

- 1. Must have been a Club member for the **past year** to enter.
- 2. All entries must be self-collected or self-produced during the past year. Labeling shall not contain the owner's name.
- 3. Only two entries per person per category. However, we encourage you to bring additional pieces to the meeting.
- 4. For **micromounts** only one entry with collector supplied microscope and light.

Only Club members present at the December meeting are eligible to enter and vote.

COMMENTS

The Creative Lapidary category will be set up by one individual, named in the November newsletter, who should be contacted by the participants prior to the meeting. Voting slips will be provided and the entries marked by number and category. Your "best of show" vote will most likely be a repeat of one of your choices. Winners from each category will receive an **engraved label** for their specimen and have their **names mentioned** in the January Newsletter. The Best of Show winners will also receive **engraved plaques** and a **Club sweat shirt** with the year embossed. The plaques are theirs to keep and display until next year's contest when new winners will be chosen and will keep the plaques until the next contest. This allows a history of winners to develop as the years go by. It is your chance to see the best of this past year and hear the stories behind the finds or creations.

These Awards were set up and started December 1995 by Vince Valade. In 2006, categories 9, cabochon and 10, Jewelry were refined. Starting in 2007 a new category 4, Micromount and category 7 and 8, redefining Best Faceted was added as well as all winners are to receive an engraved label. At the November 2007 Club meeting the contest was voted to be known as the "Vincent L. Valade Field Collecting & Creative Lapidary Awards".
