Items 1-2-3 are refundable by the Club Treasurer. Save and submit bills to the treasurer using forms provided at the November meeting

Mashed Potatoes (Item 4): <u>Mary Bubnis</u> will bring 10 pounds of mashed potatoes.

Items 1 thru 4 amounts assume about 48 people attending.

All others will bring a dish of something for the rest of us. *Everybody, except those bringing items 1-4, must bring something for the rest of us*

SUGGESTIONS: All vegetable and dessert dishes should be estimated on serving 8 people: Suggestions: squash, peas, carrots, string beans, pies (apple, pumpkin, mince, cherry, etc.), bar cookies(?), finger desserts, cakes/muffins, pickles & relish, cranberry relish, casseroles, etc. There will be ovens ready to keep dishes warm until time of serving. We begin serving about 1:30.

DRIVE SAFELY AND WE'LL ALL HAVE A GREAT HOLIDAY SEASON!

BRING Dinner, salad and desert plates. Maybe you have a special colorful plate for the occasion. Also bring cup/mug, saucer for drinks, <u>napkin</u>, and your own <u>salt & pepper</u>. If you have a special drink bring it, but booze is not allowed in the SA building or grounds. If you bring a dish remember to <u>bring serving</u> <u>utensils</u>. Bring a Holiday Center Piece for the tables if you can. Bring hors d'oeuvers if you want. And, bring a HAPPY SMILE.

<u>THE YANKEE SWAP</u> (Revised 2018) [The revision does not give all participants opportunity to swap their gifts, but greatly speeds up the process.]

Step 1 – Bring a wrapped gift of probable interest to rock, gem and mineral collectors as we have done in the past.

Step 2 – After dinner and with dishes set aside, the raffle chairperson will call the membership to order and begin a process of gift distribution. Each member participating (those who brought a gift) will be handed a wrapped gift by the chair and given a raffle ticket at the same time. The process will proceed quickly without selection by any member, except as a member participating may refuse their own gift. **The gifts will <u>not be unwrapped</u> at this time. All members will retain their dinner seating.**

Step 3 – With all gifts still wrapped, the chairperson will announce 10 (10% ?) raffle winners to come forward and wait their special opportunity to swap their still wrapped gift with others. Winners will retain their ticket.

Step 4 - The chair will now require **all <u>losers to unwrap their gifts</u>** and wait for the swap to begin. The losers must retain their dinner seating arrangement.

Step 5 - The winners in the order selected, will have the opportunity to examine all exposed gifts and <u>swap their wrapped gift as they wish</u>. The gift will be unwrapped and the winner will join the audience. <u>All tickets are to be retained by the holders</u> for the final Club gift.

Step 6 - The chair will select one or more tickets for the Club mystery gift(s) and the winner(s) to come forward.

<u>VINCE VALADE</u> <u>AWARDS:</u> (revised 2018) Self collected/created mineral and created jewelry competition.

Any mineral specimen collected in New Hampshire. B.Any mineral specimen collected <u>outside</u> of New Hampshire (i.e., anywhere in the world). C.Any self-created faceted gem stone of any size.(Small, medium, large is irrelevant) D.Any cabochon created.(A cabochon has no flat facets, but is of a rounded shape.)

A reminder to all to bring own dinner, dessert, and salad plates, flatware utensils, cup/mug & saucer, serving utensils and napkins/towels.And don't forget <u>a plastic bag to take home all dirty</u> <u>utensils</u>. Some cleaning can be done in the Salvation Army kitchen.

Remember to bring a gift for the YANKEE SWAP of \$10 pertaining to the Club purposes.Be sure to wrap it up nicely.
