#### Reports:

Story about Radioactive Minerals from the December 2008 Mineral News Submitted by Pat Barker

The collectors' displays—Sammler Vitrinen—are always a treat. Individual collectors bring specimens from their collection, illustrating a theme or a locality. This is an excellent opportunity to see material, which is not normally on public view. I was particularly thrilled by a comprehensive display of uraninite from Erzgebirge, presented by Walter Weber from Munchen around the theme "former uranium mining in Saxony." Uranium minerals rival sulphides as the most interesting minerals available to collectors. Walter Weber's case showed specimens in a range of habits and associations from many deposits. Hopefully the display and the accompanying text will help dispel the fear of "radioactive" minerals. Minerals of uranium and thorium are interesting and beautiful. They have very complex chemistry due to multiple oxidation states of the elements and several, possible hydration states of the minerals.

When it comes to "radioactive minerals" (all minerals are radioactive), many people seem to base their logic on old Flash Gordon cartoons and totally switch off their sense of logic. Yes, you could die from a given particle of photon of radiation produced by a mineral with appreciable uranium or thorium. No, I cannot totally exclude the possibility. It is, however, unlikely - so unlikely that the risk is effectively non-existent. If you apply the "safety level" to other minerals, amethyst would be banned from jewelry and collections due to the risk of being killed by silicosis. Yes, a small piece could be abraded off your amethyst, that piece might be lodged in your lungs, causing silicosis, which is fatal. The risk is low, but it is not zero. Personally, I believe a piece of amethyst is a least as hazardous as a piece of uraninite.

I hope to see you at Mineralientage Munchen (October 30-November 1, 2009). In the meantime, please wear protective clothing and a face mask when close to your mineral collection; do not let children handle minerals, store all specimens in sealed boxes, do not touch specimens with bare hands and shower thoroughly after being in a room with mineral specimens. Say three Hail Mary's every time a mineral is named and you might make it to the next year. Evidently you will not enter the halls, just hang out outside... to be on the safe side!
