The Board of Directors for approval by the club presented five new membership applications (six new members). The names are as follows, Andrea Defeo, Paul Golas, Linda Sadowski, Charlie Phillips, Nina Brown, Tim Brown, A motion was made and seconded to accept the new members presented, motion passed.

The treasurer's report was offered to the club. A motion to accept the report was made and seconded, motion passed. The treasurer indicated that he would not be at the next meeting. Any one who needs reimbursement for club expenses can obtain a form fro the club cabinet or the secretary. This form should be submitted to the secretary who will forward it to the treasurer who will ensure a check is delivered. It was discussed the need to have the president on the list of persons to sign checks. In this case it will not be an issue as he will also be unavailable for the next meeting. Old Business;

Discussed the Poland Mining cap field trip. The \$100.00 per person fee for those staying at the mining camp is due NOW. There are 22 spaces at the camp available. If the check is not received those spaces will be offered on a fist come first served basis. The cost is for food and guide services for the weekend. Space in the cabins is free. Members who wish to attend the field trip on one or both days may do so by paying \$50.00 per day. Camping space is available at the camp. New Business;
