Standard Toveco club outing info.

Toveco does not charge for a club collecting outings to any of their properties. No money will go to Toveco. The best time to choose an outing date is July. August, September. Because in most cases we have about 2 outings a year, it takes a club a bit of time to reserve an outing. Our goal is to make sure that a club's Toveco outing is one the brag about.

The best date that works currently is the weekend of August 20th 2011.

Toveco outing stipulations.

No more than 22 attendees. We can manage and make sure that 22 attendees have a great collecting outing.

The club must buy Toveco an insurance policy for the event (\$50 most often).

All Club attendees must sign a Toveco personal release waiver.

No attendees under the age of 16 and attendees under the age of 21 must be accompanied by an apparent or guardian.

There will be a mandatory 1 Hr. lunch time. Reason, gives the Toveco crew time to socialize with the attendees. It also gives us an opportunity to find out what is going on with the individual attendees (if they have found a crystal yet). Time to get the equipment into certain areas to fluff up the collecting areas.

The club must charge a fee from the attendees. This fee money stays with the club. Reason, the fee will weed out about 90 % of the something for nothing crowd. Most clubs use the money for food, drinks and prize money.
