Happy New Year! Our speaker for January is Carl Francis, past curator of the Harvard Mineralogical Museum. Yes, Carl retired as of the end of the year and he will give his first talk as a retiree to the Capital Mineral Club. Carl will be speaking on the Apatite mineral group and the Apatite subgroup. He will discuss various members of the group, their chemistry and occurrence. The primary focus will be on fluorapatite which is the most common and collectable member of the group. Mineral of the month would of course be apatite.

I have included a picture of blue Fluorapatite crystals associated with Muscovite and Albite from the Keyes Mine, in Orange, NH and a group of white Fluorapatite crystals that have grown in stacked fashion to form chains on a Quartz matrix fro Palermo #1 Mine, North Groton, NH.
