The January meeting of the Capital Mineral Club was held on the 3th of the month at the Salvation Army building on Clinton Street in Concord.

Some nice specimens were brought in by Mike Undercoffler, one for a door prize and several to be given away before the meeting to anyone who wanted them.

Meeting was called to order at 2:06.

Don Dallaire gave a talk on cataloguing and preserving a mineral collection, with an emphasis on properly labeling specimens, providing full provenance, and keeping the information clearly connected with each specimen.

The business meeting started at 3:15. Gordon Jackson motioned to accept November's minutes, Don Dallaire seconded, voted and passed. The treasurer's report from Oct 1st to the end of the year was read, with mention made that we did better on our budget than last year because the show did better, and because we did not spend all our budgeted grant money. Martin Kippley motioned to accept the treasurer's report, Francis Gill seconded, voted and passed.

Two new members, Stephen Backhurz and Stuart Goldstein, were proposed. Steffen Hermanns motioned to accept them, Tony Howard seconded, voted and passed.

Old business - The possible trip to Harvard Museum was discussed. Steffen will be looking into vans, but we are in a season where transportation is heavily booked and hard to obtain. Any further discussion was tabled until the March meeting.

Tony brought up the subject of field trips. The suggestion was made to consider having small groups of club members visit private collections as a field trip. Both Gordon Jackson and Don Dallaire volunteered their collections for this use. Some discussion followed on putting an article in the newsletter asking people if they have a collection they would be willing to show, versus directly emailing members about it. It was also suggested that members could be encouraged to bring in small collections to show at the meeting, or bring in specimens that match the mineral of the month. Mike Cordero suggested visiting Hoyt Hill again. Palermo might be available to the club again this year. Other discussions included encouraging people to stay after the meeting (if we are allowed the continued use of the room) so that people new to mineral collecting could interact with other members, and also a mention of building a good video library of presentations.

New business - Gary suggested, as a complement to the video archive, that members bookmark information they find online that other mineral collectors would find useful. Tony mentioned that articles for the newsletter would be appreciated, and should be sent to Peter Cram who will be editing the newsletter.

Drawing was held for door prizes, Tony Howard won the first one and took the piece Mike brought in, which was fortuitous as Mike won the other prize, and was able to take home something new.

Meeting was adjourned, with a reminder that there would be no meeting in February due to the show in Tucson.
