Reports:

Audubon Display Case

- The viewing area of the case is approximately 4' x 4'.
- There are 4 shelves, 3 glass and 1 wooden base, 12" between shelves.
- each shelve will hold:
- (1) 11+/- miniatures specimens.
- (2) 7 +/- small cabinet size specimens.
- (3) 5 +/- museum size specimens.

The glass shelf measurers 12" deep, 45" across the front and 56" across the back. Any educational material, pictures etc will reduce specimen space. Since the target is a younger crowd additional information is desirable but don't forget Club members also like to look at the display!.

The goal for the case is to;

- Try and rotate on a 4 month bases i.e. Jan 1st (J,F,M,A); May 1st (M,J,J,A); Sept 1st (S,O,N,D). The hope here is to maintain a fresh display and develop a "lets see the display case attitude".
- The display can be by 1 or more individuals, possibly 1 topic each shelf. From start to finish a 4 shelf display involves about 8 hours not counting the sleepless night thinking about what to display.
- Suggestions for displays can be minerals, lapidary, fossils, artifacts, Club history, etc. Anything involved with what and who the Capital Mineral Club is.
- The case is locked and under the control of the Club display chairman or his designee.

At this time President Bob Whitmore is the display chairman for the case. So think about displaying and sign up for the case. 3 to 12 people would carry the Club for the next year. September 1st is the next scheduled display change.
