It was a good way to "clean out the closet" of unused stuff. The auction took in \$92.00 and by Club vote the Salvation Army got half of the proceeds. I hope everyone had a good time with this activity.

May 6, 2012 speaker

Ken Carlsen will be speaking on minerals and their stamps. He is known to many Club members having collected in NH in the 1980's with Mike, Howard, Don and Tom. For many years he was a dealer at the Sunapee show. He was an author of the Vermont issue of Rocks & Minerals. He also authored the Eden Mills section of the book "American Mineral Treasures". The US. has at least issued two sets of four stamps. The 4 cent Tourmaline, Rhodochrosite, Amethyst and Petrified Wood set was issued in 1974. In 1992 a 29 cent set of Azurite, Copper, Variscite and Wulfenite was issued. In 2004 - 2006 a 2 cent Turquoise appeared. The real challenge of all this is the snowflake issues of 1960 and 2006. The list of the US. is dwarfed by the worlds issuing stamp countries, Ken has four volumes of geologic stamps. The display theme for this talk is minerals shown on stamps.
