#### RULES

- 1. Must have been a **Club member** for the past year to enter.
- 2. All entries must be **self-collected or self-produced** during the past year.
- 3. Only **three entries** per person per category. However, we encourage you to bring additional pieces to the meeting. For **micromounts** only one entry with collector supplying microscope and light.
- 4. Only **Club members present** at the award meeting are eligible to enter and vote.

#### **COMMENT**

Voting slips will be provided and the entries marked by number and category. Your "best of show" vote will most likely be a repeat of one of your choices. Winners from each category will receive a **Club sweat shirt** and have their **names mentioned** in the January Newsletter. The **Best of Show winners will receive engraved plaques** and a **Club sweat shirt with the year embossed**. The plaques are theirs to keep and display until next year's contest when new winners will be chosen and will keep the plaques until the next contest. This allows a history of winners to develop as the years go by. It is your chance to see the best of this past year and hear the stories behind the finds or creations.

These Awards were set up and started December 1995 by Vince Valade. In 2006, categories 9, cabochon and 10, Jewelry were refined. Starting in 2007 a new category 4, Micromount and category 7 and 8, redefining Best Faceted were added as well as all winners are to receive an engraved label.

#### 2007 Festival Report

The first thing, everyone should be proud to have been a part of the show. Any glitch was quickly solved. This happened because Lowe's is 5 minutes away, Taylor Rental 10 minutes and food around the corner and the "can do attitude" of our members.. But the best was the festival went as planned, looking as if we had been there many times before.

What happened – 30 dealers showed up - 9 more than Sunapee. Because of the open space, everything was on one floor, wide isles and bright lighting, many people thought the Sunapee show was bigger - Wrong. We had a better variety and an additional mineral dealer. Conversation with many past Sunapee goers indicated they were impressed with the Concord Festival. That fact lead Carl Francis, Curator of the Harvard Mineralogical Museum to write the Club to express his delight and articulate on the future possibilities that we have. As in real estate it is location, location, location. One minute off I-93, Exit 14. Easy access. Ample parking. Large facility. Bright lighting.

There were 1120 people in attendance for Saturday and Sunday. This compares with the highest attendance at Sunapee of 1100 over the last ten years. Though I had hoped for more, reality set in with the new date, new location winning out. I wanted to ignore those that said it will take 3 years for the show to fully catch on.

We asked over 20% of the attendees how they heard about the show. I have recalculated the responses to reflect the total attendance. Approximately 205 each (615 people) heard about us by (1) word of mouth, (2) Arena signs (2 Club signs were put up 5 days before the show) and (3) mailings. 145 heard through flyers that members passed out. 125 people reached us through road signs (20 signs were placed along connecting highways Saturday morning). 100 through newspapers. 75 through internet sources and the remainder were about evenly split at 20 each, (1) printed media (magazines), (2) Club meetings, (3) school presentation and fewer through radio. Publicity is an area we can start on early. If anyone has pictures of the show e-mail them to Steffen. We needed to develop and update a Show web page using pictures and have a press release made up for next years Show. If you think you would like to develop a press release for the Club, we sure would like to hear from you. Flyers have been made for 2008 and were passed.

The show ran about the same format as Sunapee, though one area that was greatly improved were the displays. During the last few years at Sunapee we kept losing space to the point we could only have about 12 displays. Moving to Concord allowed us to not only have all 18 Club display cases filled but we were able to have 3 additional display cases that we borrowed. The displays are one of the things that makes our show attractive and this year made that apparent. The move to the Everett Arena will allow us to continue to have great displays.

Another change from previous years was the positioning of the Club table at the front of the show. This allowed us to keep the entryway clear, not clogging the area as we have in the past. We also had 9 applications for membership which to my memory is an all time high, we must be doing something right. In 2008 the Club table will have a display case showing the December 2007 field collecting and creative lapidary winners.

We had a Concord policeman present during show hours for additional security which was appreciated by the dealers. This will be a regular practice at all future shows.

Though parking wasn't a problem this year, we need to plan ahead to maximize the designated (paved) parking area (197 spaces). Dealers will be asked to park their vehicles off pavement in the gravel (overflow) parking area east of the Arena. Club members should do the same. We should max out the paved lot when we reach an attendance around 1800. I would like to think we would reach that number with our 2009 Festival.

In closing, I would like to add that nearly 40% of the Club participated in some way and a **HUGE** thank you to everyone who worked on or at the Festival.
