Reports:

- « A motion was made by Martin Kippley to accept both the May and September Secretaries report, seconded by Don Dallaire, so moved by the membership.
- « The treasurer's report was read by Donald Dallaire. A motion to accept was made by Scott Higgins and seconded by Carlos Gristani, so moved by the membership.

Old Business:

- « Don Dallaire has had correspondence with the IRS on the Clubs' tax exempt status, we are now in full compliance.
- « Robert Whitmore brought up the change in show dates next year and subsequent years to be at the end of August, this is due to the fact that the Everett Arena will be putting in ice in September from now on. Martin Kippley made a motion that the club continue the show next year at the end of August, the motion was seconded by Scott Higgins, so moved by the membership.

### RULES

- 3. Only **three entries** per person per category. However, we encourage you to bring additional pieces to the meeting. For **micromounts** only one entry with collector supplying microscope and light.
- 4. Only **Club members present** at the award meeting are eligible to enter and vote.

### COMMENT

Voting slips will be provided and the entries marked by number and category. Your "best of show" vote will most likely be a repeat of one of your choices. Winners from each category will receive a **Club sweat shirt** and have their **names mentioned** in the January Newsletter. The **Best of Show winners will receive engraved plaques** and a **Club sweat shirt with the year embossed**. The plaques are theirs to keep and display until next year's contest when new winners will be chosen and will keep the plaques until the next contest. This allows a history of winners to develop as the years go by. It is your chance to see the best of this past year and hear the stories behind the finds or creations.

These Awards were set up and started December 1995 by Vince Valade. In 2006, categories 9, cabochon and 10, Jewelry were refined. Starting in 2007 a new category 4, Micromount and category 7 and 8, redefining Best Faceted were added as well as all winners are to receive an engraved label.

### 2008 FESTIVAL REPORT

The Club broke last years record! We set up in about 2 hours less and had about 250 more paying adults. An attendance of 1360 people. It all points to - we know what we are doing and that means a BIG THANK YOU TO ALL THAT HELPED!!!

This year's Festival had the same number of dealers supporting 16 more tables. The increase in attendance can be attributed to word of mouth (LETS KEEP TALKING IT UP), increased road signage and the weather. We competed with the Deerfield Fair and an outside Chili cook off in Concord both would be affected by the rain and we are inside and dry.

The Saturday dealer/worker cookout was a success with several dealers thanking us for the effort. However I am sad to say everything went as planned so there are no stories or notable events to remember.

Next years Festival will be August 29 and 30 and open one hour earlier on Sunday. We now are "Always the weekend before Labor Day" the reason for the move is the City needs to break even or make money on the Arena and with energy costs involved with making summer ice they eliminated summer ice making and starting winter ice a month earlier - September. We also used a post card for our mailing since it is easier and cheaper to mail. The brochure involves considerable effort and roughly \$900 in expense, it will be dropped. The post card will have 3 New Hampshire minerals pictured on the front and Festival information printed on the back. The pictures will have good location data, collecting date and be aesthetically pleasing. Owner information is optional at the owner's request. The biggest issue in producing the post card is obtaining suitable pictures. THAT'S WHERE YOU COME IN. I would like to see a committee gather pictures and info and determine the photos to be used. If everything works out we could have several years worth of pictures and some nice postcards. So get busy and get some interesting digital pictures.

Displays were great. Now is the time for new large cases. The cases are worn, they were acquired in the late 70's or early 80's. The second problem is that we now have no room in the Club trailer since the cases are too cumbersome and weak to break down. The cases need to be sturdy, break down easily and be light. The board is currently looking into new cases and hopefully the Club will approve their design.

At the Club table we had for sale 10 power lopes, thumbnail boxes, 2" x 2" x 2" boxes, 2" x 2" half size boxes, mineral tack and Morrill's "New Hampshire Mines and Mineral Locations" all available to Club members at cost.

Again, through the efforts of the Club, Kevin Downey spoke to the Rundlett Junior High 8<sup>th</sup> grade class on his caving experiences. The teachers and students were given free passes to the Festival.

With the change in date for the 2009 show we probably won't see an increase in attendance but with the Club's continued effort we shouldn't see any decrease. Let's hope next years Festival is as successful and a testament to the Club.
