### Final 2010 Festival Report

As in the past we have had good response from Club members in setting up and breaking down and clean up. This is something you can feel proud of and I want to say thank you. We have become skilled enough to have the show setup completed by noon and in time for the workers lunch (I am sorry I eat all the cookies). I don't think this ever happened at Sunapee and the show was half the size.

The electrical system needs some additional work and Jon Herndon has agreed to take this on. Jon has been overly helpful in making sure electrical system is maintained up to snuff and we don't run into a big problem at the show. I am sure Jon would like to have another club member involved who can work with and understand the system and setup. Though not in the electrical area, we became exposed to the lack of a co or sub-chairman this year. We have operated this way for several years and have gotten away without a crises. The show has doubled in size since Sunapee and we need to have people available when the Dealer Chairmen (me) becomes sick, killed in an airplane crash, family crises or an opportunity of a lifetime appears and there is someone ready to step in so I won't feel so sad dying in the plane crash. Right now the Show Chairmen, Club table, Cookout, Dealer, Display, Electrical, Publicity, Ticket & Trailer Chairmen are without a backup. If you can help in this area, the 2011 Show Chairman is Steffen and he will be glad to hear from you and steer you in the right direction. I am sure many of the chairmen would be glad to become Co-chairman if you would like to really jump in.

The show again dropped in attendance this year, 899 paying. There are several reasons some beyond our control. The ECONOMY, WEATHER and AIR SHOW. Other factors are the SPRINGFIELD SHOW, two weeks before, PARENT/SCHOOL SHOPPING and PUBLICITY. Of these, for 2011 the one area we can concentrate on is PUBLICITY. If anyone is good at or would like to try and develop a PRESS RELEASE (package) and contact area media, I think we would attract a larger attendance. Another area is SHOW WEBSITE, again someone to expand the Show information on the Club's website.

There is some interest in expanding our exposer to children. Develop and man some type of game, Better promote the "Kids Bucket" (free mineral). This year The Museum Piece (Larry Venezia) had geodes to break open. This is attractive to kids and since he will be doing this next year, it is something we can promote.

We will be early on developing a poster to promote the Show. We need you to help out and identify places that a poster would be good and make sure it happens. Most people who come to the show are within a 50 mile radius.

I am not the best in saying thank you but one of the ways that has been mentioned and done in the past is have some type of Show tee shirt. This would Identify Club workers and replace the arm band. It should be bright and one for women and men or unisex and identify the Club. Again is there someone who would like to take this on. I am sure there are several fashion designers in the Club.

I think if we continue to put our best foot forward we will continue to be one of the best New England Shows and for that you can be proud to be a Capital Mineral Club member. Help Steffen out and show him how many hands make light work.
