As always we have had good response from Club members in setting up and breaking down and clean up, though we get a little thin on Sunday night. This is something you can feel proud of and I want to say thank you to all those who helped. We have become skilled enough to have the show setup completed by noon and in time for the workers/dealers lunch which I make sure there will be enough cookies. I want to believe as the Club continues, that our set-up will be even more skilled.

The electrical system again will need additional work and Jon Herndon has agreed AGAIN to take this on. Jon makes sure the electrical system is maintained up to snuff and we don't run into a big problem at the show.

We had an attendance of 901 paying adults and approximately 121 people, 12 and under. The dealers that I talked to had a decent show. We have 31 retail and 3 wholesale dealers which makes us the largest Club show in New England, but to insure happy dealers, we still need to make the attendance grow. This year, through the efforts of Annette Comeau, we had ads in the Union Leader, Concord Monitor and the Concord Insider and plan to do the same and possibly more next year.

We provided our own hourly gift coupon of \$10.00 (12 drawings) at the suggestion of Charlie Forsberg which makes the system run smoother and easier to manage. Five dealers returned the coupon for a refund.

Like always, we continue to have displays that get comments of high praise (Bob Whitmore, Display Chairman), as does the Saturday night barbeque (Don Dallaire, Cook-Out Chairman). The Show will move forward next year because this tired, old Show-Chairman has been replaced by the Board. I am pleased to say Annette Comeau has accepted and will be the 2013 (50th Show) Show-Chairman. Annette already has some new blood Chairing some of the areas and several good ideas. Now is the time for the Club to show their support and help out. If we continue to break down the tasks (many hands make light work) and share the work load, 2013 (50th Festival) will be our best!
