Gilsum, NH Little Town with Heart

Perhaps no other subject or geographic area has been praised or written about more in our show reports than Gilsum, New Hampshire. This year, once again, Gilsum distinguished itself with another record rock and mineral show.

Saturday, June 23rd, 2007 a new record first day was set for the Gilsum Rock and Mineral Swap. The village of 780 residents hosted 6,000 visitors on the grounds surrounding Gilsum School. This is a "best estimate" from show chair Rob Mitchell.

Rob and his committee gather figures based on gate donations from parking and volunteers who monitor traffic flow. The previous record first day attendance was set in 2004 during the 40th anniversary celebration of the show with 5,000 collectors and families attending opening day.

This was our seventh year as dealers. It was also a "homecoming" as we marked our very first visit to Gilsum way back in June of 1997, ten years! Returning to Gilsum is now equivalent to a vacation, business trip, and annual reunion with friends and "family." Since the past 43^{rd} show and a very positive two-day experience for us, I reflected on just what makes Gilsum repeat success year after year. Probably there are no pat answers. My feeling is that it is in the "heart" of people, who organize set-up, operate and volunteer their time for those two important days.

Gilsum is a town covering 16.7 square miles in the beautiful Ashuelot River valley. The town once was a center for mining activity that produced feldspar, mica and high quality beryl, tourmaline and quartz. Over 60 old mine locations in surrounding areas are now quiet testimony to times past.

Aside from the town store, church, library, post office and automotive garage, the town still maintains a humble and quiet assortment of cottage businesses such as a pizza parlor, a sports graphics shop. World famous W.S. Badger Company which makes lip balms, potions and other natural products fills out the town business listings.

Local demography based on the last census indicates a population of 780 with approximately 301 households. In those households there are 220 families 24.6 percent of which have children under the age of 18 years old. (Census figures) That computes to about 54 families with children.

My knowledge of the Gilsum Recreation Committee, even after all these years was sketchy. I contacted committee chairman, Rob Mitchell. He was kind enough to give his usual same day reply.

Rob stated that six non-profit community organizations run concessions. They contribute 10% of their profits to the Recreation Committee to use for the recreation programs. The committee is made up of representatives from fifteen town organizations. Each has a vote as to how the event is run and how the money is spent.

He says, "Volunteers help with parking, the information booth, setup and tear down. In past years Keene Sentinel newspaper of the nearest large town usually offered sponsorship and advertising for the show.

Rob estimates that between all the events, Gilsum Rock Swap and Mineral Show engages time of approximately 60 people. Townspeople donating homemade beans, coleslaw and pies for the Saturday night dinner plus other volunteer activities swell the ranks of the active to about 100.

All told, by all estimates, about 12.82% of Gilsum's population offer time, goods and/or talent to making Gilsum one continuous success story. This year show attendance was between 6,000 to 8.000 visitors comprised of collectors and families. Rob attributes success of the annual show to volunteers and small town hospitality. He states that "the community pulls together to

Gilsum, New Hampshire is proof of a little town that could that did, and still does prove itself year after year for 43 years. Gilsum is probably the finest open air small town rock and mineral swap/show in the northeast, perhaps the whole country.

This beautiful little New Hampshire town sets a splendid example, sets the bar for rock and mineral shows every where. Gilsum is a tribute to efforts by small and dedicated groups of individuals to make a difference in their community or club.

June 2008 is just months away. Set your travel plans up to include a visit to the Gilsum Rock Swap and Mineral Show June 28-29, 2008. Linda and I will be there as dealers, doing our part to make the show a success.
