Spent some time this morning going through the door prize slips and found the following trivia items:

First time visitors 163  
return visitors 303

total slips turned in 468 this number also counts the two slips in the show prize drawing that I'm not sure which they were. I don't have Saturday attendance from last year handy but I think that this is really not too bad given everything that competed with our event this year.

Looking at the %'s shows that this year 35% of attendees were first time visitors which indicates that the word did get out to some new people. The 65% of folks that were repeats means that they also got the word but I don't think we got enough of them back in the door. Backing this up is the fact that we sent out about 2800 postcards this year. As of today, 107 came back to me as not able to be delivered. This is down from over 300 returned at his point last year with about the same number (2800) mailed out last year. If you put the attending show returns over the postcards sent we only got 11% of the previous years attendees back to the show. From this info we may want to change our plan and consider using the cards to offer an admission discount or promote a special drawing with a nice prize featured on the postcard for the people bringing in the postcards to get more of these previous year's people back in the door. I would favor the drawing vs. the discount because the 5 dollar admission sure makes the front door job a lot easier. At wholesale prices, you could get a really nice specimen for \$250 and still be only half the cost of offering 500 returning guests a \$1 admission reduction. If not one of these ideas, we should at least look at cheaper postcards because we are spending lots of time and money on these for at most a 11% return in gate entries and many of these people would come because they want to even without the postcard mailing. I am open to other suggestions as well.

I also think we need to get someone closer to Concord to run Publicity while I continue to do the mailings. I don't think we are getting as much as we could be from local press but I'm just not able to get over there to promote it.
