

Presentation for September meeting Calcite

Calcite is a very common mineral but is rather scarce in New Hampshire. Calcite is one of the most abundant minerals in all of the earth's rock types except in pegmatites.

Calcite crystallizes in the trigonal crystals and can have a multitude of different forms and twins.

In New Hampshire calcite occasionally has turned up in a few pegmatites in the Conway granites as well as other rock types in Littleton, Raymond and Westmoreland.
