Talk for May New Mexico Mineral Symposium and field trip to the Blanchard mine

The Rochester Mineralogical Symposium that ran for 50 years was terminated in 2023 when their long term venue was lost. The symposium went virtual in 2020 due to Covid-19. No other suitable or affordable venue was found in Rochester, NY. The location in Rochester was required by the parent organization, the Rochester Academy of Sciences.

This was a great loss to the mineral community so a few of us decided to attend the New Mexico Mineral Symposium as a replacement for Rochester. Mineral symposiums provide a forum for both professionals and armatures interested in mineralogy. There are always new contacts made as well as new information learned that increases your mineralogical knowledge.

The event is held on the campus of New Mexico
Tech at Socorro in November. This talk will review
the activities and presentations at the symposium
as well as the excellent mineral museum in the
Bureau of Geology building.

A bonus in attending the symposium was a field trip to the Blanchard mine in Bingham. New Mexico. The mine is in the Hansonburg mining district approximately 60 kilometers south east of Socorro. It is a lead mine with barite-fluoritegalena mineralization. Over 50 mineral species are found at the mine.
